Clam Bake



INGREDIENTS

- 8 medium red potatoes, scrubbed
- 1 pound clams in shell, scrubbed
- 1 pound mussels, cleaned and debearded
- 1/2 pound unpeeled large shrimp
- 1 (48 fluid ounce) can chicken broth
- 1/4 cup dry vermouth (optional)
- 3/4 cup butter, divided
- 1 loaf French bread

DIRECTIONS

1. Place a potatoes in a layer in the bottom of a large pot. Cover with a layer of clams, then mussels, and finally the shrimp. Pour in the vermouth and enough

chicken broth to fill the pot halfway. You may not need all of the broth, depending on the size of your pot. Cut half of the butter into cubes and place on top of the seafood. Cover with a lid, and seal tightly with aluminum foil.

2. Bring to a boil, then simmer over medium-low heat for 45 minutes. Remove from the heat, and carefully remove the foil and lid. Remove the seafood and potatoes from the liquid to serve. Melt 1/2 remaining butter, and divide into 4 individual dishes for dipping. Serve with the rest of the butter and French bread.

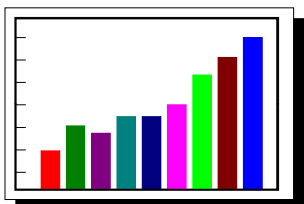

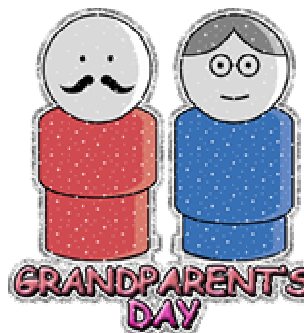

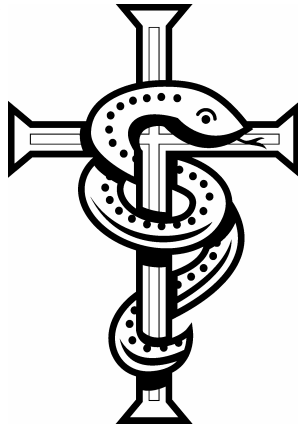

The **BRONZE SERPENT** or Brazen Serpent on a Cross is a symbol for Jesus. In John 3:14-15 (NRSV), Jesus said, "And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life." Jesus was referring to an Old Testament story, when God sent poisonous serpents because the Israelites grumbled impatiently in the desert. "And the Lord said to Moses, 'Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live.' So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live" (Numbers 21:8-9).

SAFETY & SECURITY AT BROADMAN...

The mindset of the world has changed dramatically. In the last several years, churches have had to deal with theft, vandalism, arson, even shootings to name a few. Sadly, these occurrences have increased at an alarming rate. What was once unthinkable—entering a place of worship to do physical harm—has occurred several times in recent years in churches throughout the country.

As Trustees, we must provide protection to God's people and allow them to worship in a safe, secure environment. Our church, and what we have *in* this church, belongs to God. It is our responsibility to safeguard these resources. God calls on all of us to be accountable and to be good stewards.

In the Book of Nehemiah we learned of Nehemiah's persistence as he rebuilt the walls of Jerusalem to protect God's people. He did so with the help of thousands of workers. As they worked to rebuild the wall, enemies from both inside and outside the city kept a steady flow of delay tactics coming. Nehemiah had faith that the will of God would prosper. So the wall was finished and the city was secure and God's people were protected.

Building a wall to protect God's people is the same principle the Trustees use to protect the worshipers at Broadman. Certainly we don't want the church to become an armed fortress, but we, the Trustees, have taken proactive steps to identify potential risks to our safety and security and offer practical solutions. One example of this has been the addition of locks on the sanctuary doors. The locks were put in place to protect the assets of the church. They are NOT intended to lock anyone out of or in the sanctuary.

If you have a legitimate need to enter the sanctuary during off hours, you may contact your deacon, a trustee or facilities leader to gain access.

Rest assured there is a security plan in place at Broadman. You can worship here knowing that your safety and security is a priority. From the children in the nursery to the cars in the parking lot, the security team at Broadman is here to provide the first line of defense against any breach of security.

KEEPING AN EYE ON CULTURE...

It is important to keep our eye on culture. Part of the reality of American culture is that a vast majority say they believe in God. There is also a large demographic of people who have stepped foot in the church but for one reason or another have left and not returned. Why have they left and what do we do? Consider the following facts:

- Most Americans have been to church and yet only 20% are regular attendees. - *The American Church in Crisis*
- 82% of the unchurched are at least somewhat likely to attend church if invited - *Dr Thom Rainer*
- "Only 2% of church members invite an unchurched person to church. 98% of church-goers never extend an invitation in a given year." *Dr Thom Rainer*
- "71% of Americans are absolutely certain there is a God." - *The Pew Forum on Religion and Public Life's U.S. Religious Landscape Survey*
- "56% of Americans believe that religion is very important in one's life." - *The Pew Forum on Religion and Public Life's U.S. Religious Landscape Survey*
- "80% of Americans believe in God." - *Harris Interactive*
- "73% of people who don't attend church were never invited." - *Barna Group*
- "83% of adults claim to be Christians" - *American Religious Identification Survey 2008*
- 50% of the current U.S. population would be candidates for a Back to Church Campaign. - Gary L. McIntosh, D.Min., Ph.D.

What an opportunity we have in a culture that has gone morally astray in many ways. There is truly hope if we will simply ask people to come to church. Let's change the culture by asking people to come to church. Broadman cannot afford to be like the 98% of all church goers who never invited someone to church.

Jesus said the fields are ready for harvest but the laborers are few. Jesus was right and as we keep an eye on our culture His Words should challenge us to impact our culture with the power of a personal invitation.

JUMONVILLE...**JUMONVILLE RETREAT...**

In early August, twenty four from Broadman had a wonderful weekend retreat at Jumonville, in the southwestern mountains of Pennsylvania. Our accommodations and food were great and being with fellow Christian friends made this retreat special. The beauty of the area is topped off by a massive 60 foot lighted cross which stands on retreat grounds atop Dunbar's knob.

Jumonville is located near two history-making sites. Nearby is the glen where in May 1754, George Washington and 40 of his men attacked a small French force, killing 9, including their commander Coulon de Jumonville. This incident was the spark that led to the Seven Years War that raged in Europe between England and France. Also nearby is Fort Necessity, where in July 1754, a French force led by Jumonville's half-brother defeated Washington's army in retaliation for the May incident.

If you are a senior adult, plan to join us on our next Jumonville retreat in August 2010. Our testimony is that this is a meaningful experience that one will never forget.

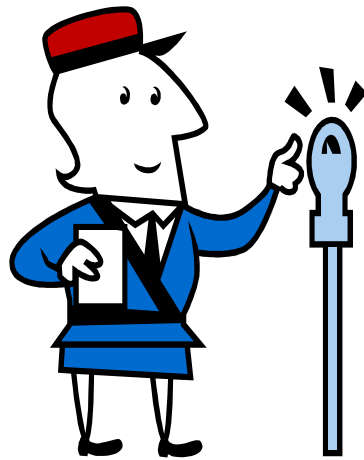

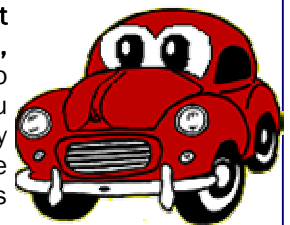
PARKING METER: Feeding the Meter!

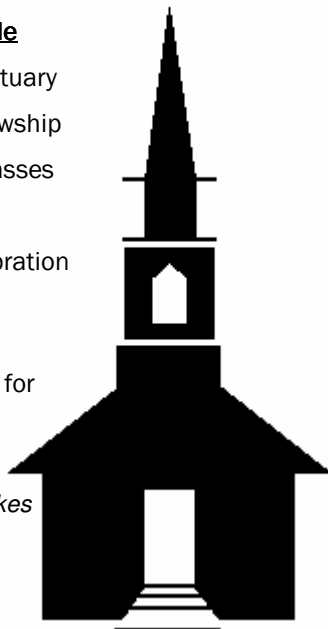
