RECIPE OF THE MONTH

**EASY BROWNIE
SHORTCAKE**



INGREDIENTS

- 1 (19.5 ounce) package brownie mix
- 1 (16 ounce) container BREAKSTONE'S or KNUDSEN Sour Cream, divided
- 1 cup thawed COOL WHIP Whipped Topping
- 1 tablespoon powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 3 cups cut-up mixed strawberries and peeled kiwi

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Prepare brownie batter as directed on package; stir in 1/2 cup sour

cream. Spoon into greased and floured 9-inch round cake pan.

Bake 45 min.; cool 10 min. Remove from pan to wire rack; cool completely.

Mix remaining sour cream, whipped topping, sugar and vanilla. Cut brownie horizontally in half. Place bottom half on plate; spread with half of the sour cream mixture. Cover with top of brownie, remaining sour cream mixture and fruit. Store in refrigerator.

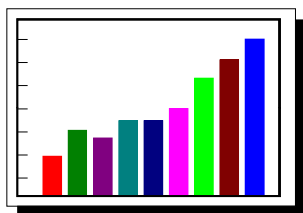

Do you know the legend of the Cherokee Indian youth's rite of Passage?

WORLDVIEW IS EVERYWHERE...

Worldview shows up everywhere. It is in almost every academic discipline imaginable. Worldview influences the fields of science, philosophy, religion, politics, academics and much more. Worldview is everywhere.

I have been seeking to clearly define worldview in my mind for quite sometime. It is a huge concept that affects all of life. I have studied and read many articles and books on this topic matter. I have also evaluated my own worldview to access what in my life is not compatible with God's worldview. Lastly, I have engaged our congregation and our community with worldview issues as well and plan to continue to do so.

One must understand that worldview is a set of values, beliefs and presuppositions that we have about our world that influence our thoughts and behaviors consciously and unconsciously. Therefore, our worldview defines our reality and determines how we should live our lives in the reality we have created through our worldview. Also understanding that we cannot escape our worldview, because it in everyday influences our thoughts and behaviors consciously and unconsciously; therefore, our only course of action is to

understand our worldview, discover how it influences our lives and then make adjustments when our worldview falls short of God's worldview based on the Scriptures.

With this in mind let's look at our culture and the worldview in America. There is good and bad news that comes with a simplistic understanding of an American worldview. Simply put we have a dualistic worldview in America. The good news is that Christianity has impacted America's worldview. This impact comes across in our worldview on a daily basis for many of us. Sometimes this impact is for the good and in other ways it is for the bad, depending upon the presuppositions about Christianity one holds. Some people in America hold a Christian worldview that is negative. They consider Christians, the church and perhaps even Jesus as bad for our culture.

The other side of this dualistic worldview is that a vast majority of people in America would call themselves Christians, but how they think and behave is anything but Christian. Why? Because their worldview is distorted by the other portion of America's worldview called secularism. Because America is highly secular today these influences strongly impact our worldview. Even highly devoted Christians are impacted by the various secular worldviews of our culture and day i.e. evolution, existentialism, new age, naturalism, media influence, politics, social programs, education system and so forth.

So what are we to do? Romans 12:1-2 clearly would lead us to not conform to the world, but be transformed and in fact transform our culture.

Romans 12:1-2 (HCSB)

Therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, I urge you to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God; this is your spiritual worship. ² Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may discern what is the good, pleasing, and perfect will of God.

How are we to do this? We have to have a Biblical worldview and try to eliminate all the other influences that guide our thoughts, actions and behaviors. Sounds easy...but its not! Transformation is a painful process. Our beliefs, values and presuppositions can be altered but it is usually a long, hard, painful experience. I believe this process has to start with every believer and it also must be part of the church's responsibility to help the body of Christ focus on transforming our worldview to be biblical. We as Christians must start acknowledging that there are areas in our lives in which we do not think biblically and start the process of transformation.

The only way we are going to help America and our world to overcome this dualistic worldview of the sacred and the secular is to let the change begin with us...the people of God must truly practice what we preach and be transformed.

BUILDING A CHURCH...

Computer programmer Amy Hughes found a unique way to express her faith. The Lego enthusiast built a church out of 75,000 Lego pieces. The church is about 7' by 5 1/2' and seats 1,372 little Lego people. The building has almost 4,000 windows, mosaics, an altar and crucifix, a pulpit, a detailed pipe organ, a narthex, bathrooms, stairs and a balcony that seats an 80-member choir. Hughes, who once dreamed of being an architect, spent a year and a half on her project, dubbed the Abston Church of Christ. ("Abston" is a fictional name derived from ABS, the type of plastic used to make Legos.) She also used the Lego church as an exercise in sermon-writing. Pondering why people seek refuge in a house of God, Hughes writes, "The Lord is here because we are here, not because we built a beautiful building."

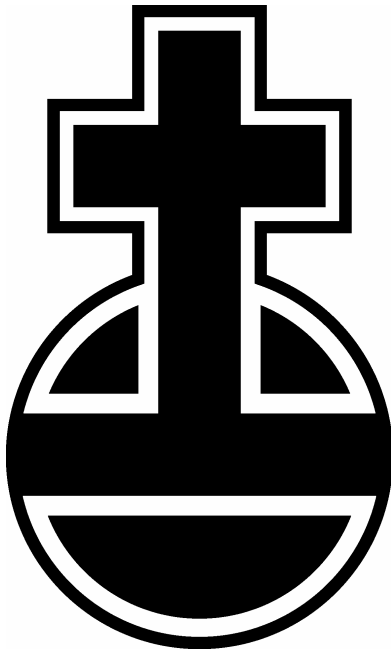

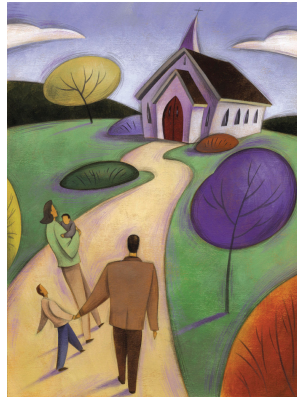

Nineteenth-century pastor Charles Haddon (C.H.) Spurgeon was known as the “prince of preachers.” He founded a seminary in London, now named Spurgeon’s College, and taught young pastors-in-training how to prepare sermons.

Spurgeon often gave students a Scripture text and then had them deliver extemporaneous sermons. One afternoon, he assigned Luke 19:1-10 to the shortest class member.

The student immediately stood up and said, “Mr. President and brethren, my subject is Zacchaeus, and it is therefore most appropriate to me. First, Zacchaeus was little of stature, as am I. Second, Zacchaeus was up a tree; so am I. Third, Zacchaeus made haste to come down; so will I.”

When the young man sat down, his classmates urged him to continue. But Spurgeon loved the sermon, saying, “No, he could not add anything to such a perfect little speech without spoiling it.”

THE 10 FOOT RULE...

Some churches follow the 10-foot rule: When anyone is within 10 feet of another person on church grounds, he or she offers a warm welcome and cheerful greeting.

This rule originated with Wal-Mart founder SamWalton, who encouraged store employees to look customers in the eye, greet them and ask if they needed help.

As an ambitious college student in Missouri, Walton discovered that “one of the secrets to campus leadership was the simplest thing of all: Speak to people coming down the sidewalk before they speak to you.”

Walton used the person’s name if he knew it. “But even if I didn’t, I would still speak to them,” he said. “Before long, I probably knew more students than anybody in the university, and they recognized me and considered me their friend.”

No sincere welcome is unimportant, even if necessity requires brevity

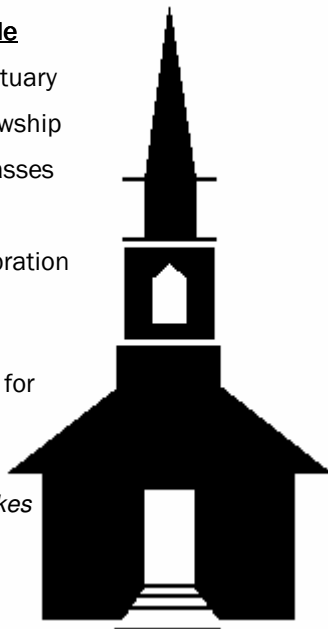
