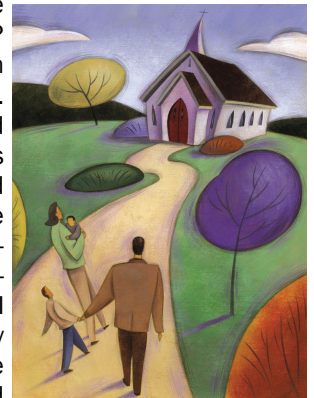
## Pastor's Corner

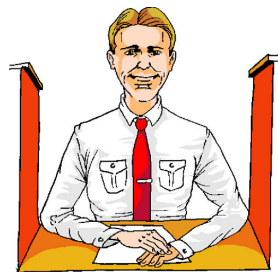
**TELLERS...**

**RECIPE OF THE MONTH**

**Sauerkraut Balls**



**INGREDIENTS...**

- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 1 cup finely chopped cooked ham
- 1 cup finely chopped corned beef
- 1/2 clove garlic, crushed
- 6 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 cups sauerkraut, drained and minced
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley
- 1/2 cup beef broth
- egg
- 2 cups milk
- 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 4 cups fine dry bread crumbs
- 1 quart oil for frying

**DIRECTIONS...**

In a large skillet, melt butter over medium-low heat. Add onion and cook until softened. Stir in ham, corned beef and garlic. Cook mixture, stirring constantly for 1 minute. Stir in 6 tablespoons flour and cook mixture over moderate heat, stirring occasionally, for 3 minutes.

Stir in sauerkraut, parsley, and broth; cook for 3 minutes or until thickened and paste-like. Spread mixture on a platter and chill for at least 3 hours.

Heat oil in deep-fryer to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). In a bowl, whisk together the egg, milk and 2 1/2 cups flour. Shape the sauerkraut mixture by level teaspoons in to balls, dip them into the egg mixture and roll them in the bread crumbs.

Fry balls in batches for 2 to 3 minutes or until golden brown. Transfer to paper towels to drain. Serve warm.

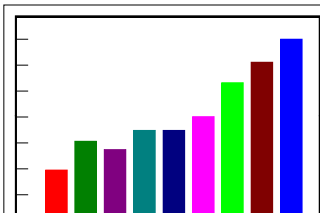

**Are we ready? (PART 1)**

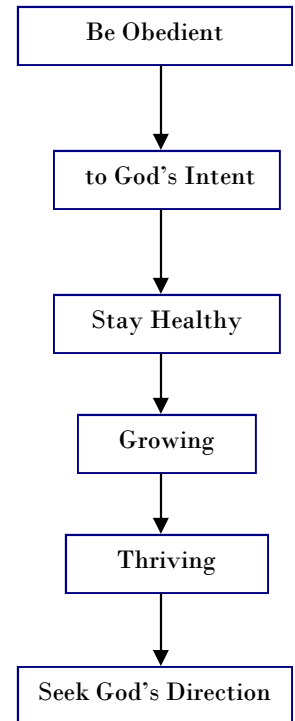
The church is a living organism that God calls the Body of Christ. It is God's intent for His body to be healthy, growing and thriving. In order to do that the church must constantly seek God's direction and be obedient to His leading. This article is intended to make us think about the future of our church specifically in the area of church growth. I want you to ask yourself if our church is restructuring for growth?

In this edition we will focus on numeric growth. As we talk about numbers keep in mind that numbers represent people...God's greatest asset. People make the church...we are God's people. So are we prepared for numeric growth? Do we even want to continue to grow? I hope so, because I believe that if an organization is healthy it grows and if we care about the church then we need to care about people. I believe that God wants us to have numeric growth...it is to be expected. So the real question is are we prepared for it and are we pursuing it God's way?

How important is the structure of a church for growth? Does a congregation of 100 have the same structure as a church of 500? Do we need to structure differently to reach higher levels of growth? Are we preparing and restructuring ourselves NOW for greater growth?

I believe these questions are important. What will it take for us to grow? I want you to walk away from this article with two key points. Make an appointment with your pastor or church counselor and explain the situation as best you can. Seriously consider any suggestions you receive.

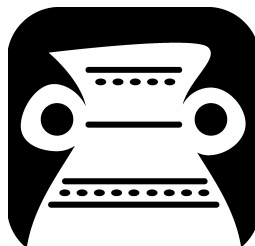
Don't freeze up or ignore the problem. That will only make it worse. Instead, look at the problem in all its ugliness, keep praying and use your best judgment to face it head-on.

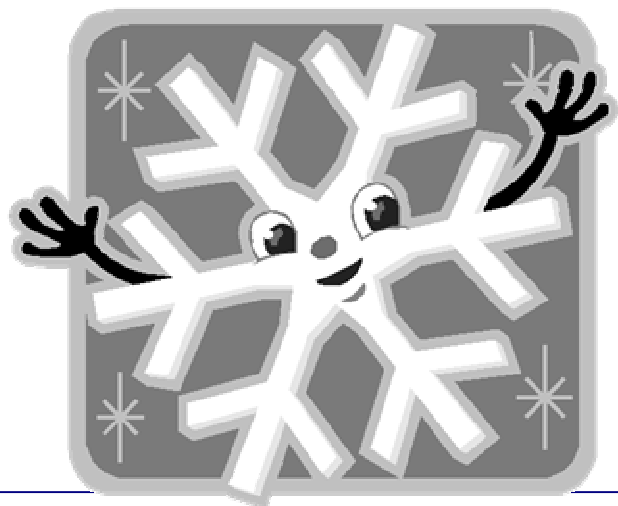

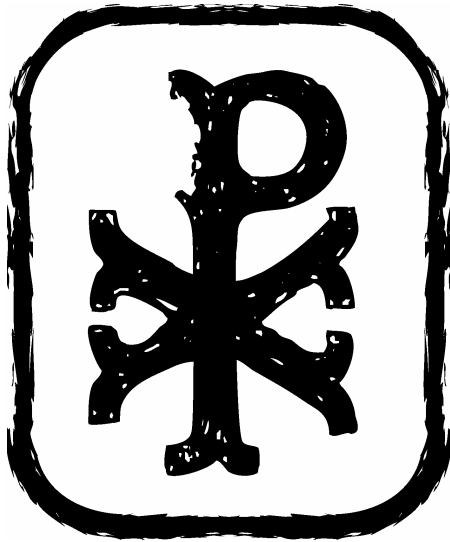

**Chi Rho...**

The Chi Rho is an ancient monogram of Christ. The symbol is composed of the first two letters of the Greek word for Christ: XPICTOC (pronounced Christos). There are many variations, but the most common form superimposes the "X" (Chi) on the "P" (Rho). Although it isn't considered to be a cross, the Chi Rho invokes Jesus' crucifixion. The symbol has been in use for more than 1,600 years. Early Christians used the Chi Rho as a sign of their faith, and Constantine the Great placed it on his soldiers' shields.

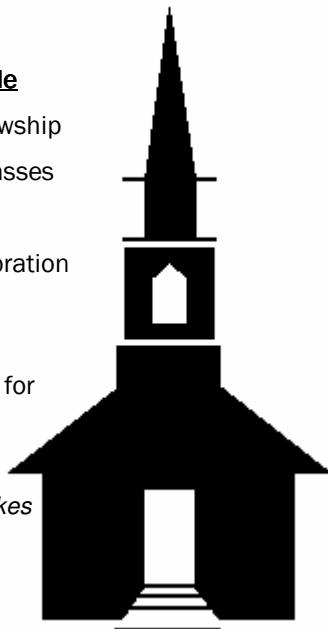
