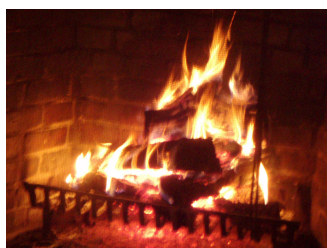
then the upcoming sermon series is for you.

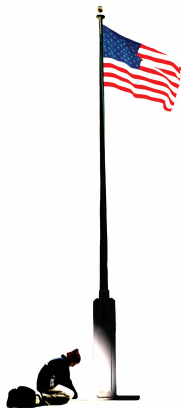

SEE YOU AT THE POLE...

In April 1990, a group of Christian teenagers in Burleson, Texas, decided to pray around the flagpoles at three schools. Thanks to word-of-mouth publicity and announcements at youth rallies, that September about 45,000 students prayed around flagpoles at 1,200 schools in four states.



See You at the Pole (SYATP) is now an annual, international event. Students of all ages organize prayer gatherings outside of regular school hours, usually at 7 a.m. local time. Many parents, teachers and youth pastors join in. This year's event occurs on September 24.

Student-led prayer, even at public schools, is free speech protected by the U.S. Constitution. By gathering around their flagpoles, young people take a stand for Christ as they call on his name in prayer.

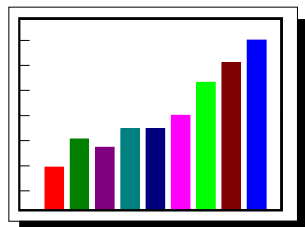

RECIPE OF THE MONTH...

FALL CLAM BAKE



INGREDIENTS

INGREDIENTS (Nutrition)

8 medium red potatoes, scrubbed

1 pound clams in shell, scrubbed

1 pound mussels, cleaned and debearded

1/2 pound unpeeled large shrimp

1 (48 fluid ounce) can chicken broth

3/4 cup butter, divided

1 loaf French bread

DIRECTIONS

Place a potatoes in a layer in the bottom of a large pot. Cover with a layer of clams, then mussels, and finally the shrimp. Pour in the ver-

mouth and enough chicken broth to fill the pot halfway. You may not need all of the broth, depending on the size of your pot. Cut half of the butter into cubes and place on top of the seafood. Cover with a lid, and seal tightly with aluminum foil.

Bring to a boil, then simmer over medium-low heat for 45 minutes. Remove from the heat, and carefully remove the foil and lid. Remove the seafood and potatoes from the liquid to serve. Melt 1/2 remaining butter, and divide into 4 individual dishes for dipping. Serve with the rest of the butter and French bread.

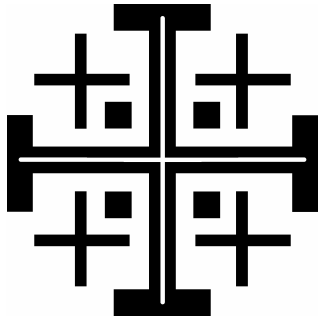

JERUSALEM CROSS

This complex cross, also called the Crusader's Cross or Fivefold Cross, has several interpretations. The main cross is composed of four tau (T) crosses representing the Old Testament law. The four small Greek crosses symbolize the fulfillment of the law in the gospel.

The five crosses together represent the church's mission: to spread the gospel to the four corners of the earth. They're also said to symbolize Christ's five wounds (hands, feet and side). Godfrey de Bouillon, the first ruler of Jerusalem after it was liberated from the Muslims, used the cross on his coat-of-arms. It was also embodied in the heraldry of the Crusaders.

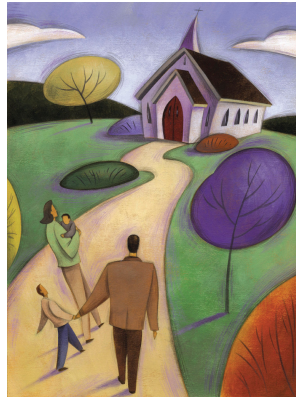


FAITHFULNESS...

**BEING A CHRISTIAN CITIZEN**

All of us who are followers of Jesus Christ - are Christian Citizens. As Christian Citizens of the United States of America, we have many freedoms and luxuries that many Christians of previous generations never had. We actually have the freedom to vote and have a voice in our culture. As a result we can influence policies and be a part of the process of electing those who represent us as leaders. This is an awesome honor that we should never take for granted.

Despite the honor we have been given, being a Christian Citizen in America is not an easy thing. It comes with great responsibility to exercise our faith as Christian Citizens. However, surveys have shown that many believers do not vote at all and those who do vote often do not vote biblically. In other words we have this awesome freedom that past generations have not been given and we fail to exercise it. And if we do exercise that freedom we fail to use it for God's glory by not voting biblically. This means that we are not applying our faith to everyday life. As a result we fail to be the salt and light God has called us to be to our generation in our culture to the fullest extent.

Despite the unique privilege of freedom we have in

this nation as citizens, we must realize that even in America these privileges may not always exist. I believe that true followers of Christ who exercise their God-given right of citizenship may face the risk of losing this freedom or at least being severely persecuted if they exercise their mandate to be "salt" and "light". It could easily be argued that this is already taking place and that it is Christians who are often discriminated against in the public arena if they actually try to be involved in the political process of our nation. I believe this has come about because many Christians have failed in their Christian Citizen duties to be a watchman on the tower protecting the society and culture of America. This should be a wake up call to all of us. We should never take our freedom and right to vote as a Christian Citizen for granted. In America Christians have a unique opportunity to elect the governing officials that will support their Christian values and ideals, that will promote policies that are the best for our society and culture, and that will help establish a nation that is truly under God. Samuel Adams, a founding father of our great nation once said, "Let each citizen remember at the moment he is offering his vote that he is executing one of the most solemn trusts in human society for which he is accountable to God and his country."

As your pastor I take my duty as a citizen of this Nation very seriously. I believe part of my responsibility to God is to equip you in this area of everyday life. So let me state this clearly, it is our duty as Christians to vote and to vote in such a way that honors God for the good of our society and

future generations. It is also important to realize that God calls us to be the "salt" and "light" with our vote. If our vote is not bathed in prayer and based on biblical principles then our vote is worldly, not "salt" and "light."

So where does this leave us today? According to the Family Research Council millions of Christians in America are not even registered to vote for this upcoming election. So let me first encourage you to register to vote. There are voter registration forms available at the church kiosk. If you are not registered to vote, please take the time to do this immediately. I believe the failure to register to vote when it is a God-given right is a sin. God wants His followers to vote. I truly believe this. Secondly, God wants our vote to count. May your vote honor God and represent a biblical worldview. As stated previously, many Americans do not incorporate their faith or biblical values into their voting choices, I believe that is a sin in God's eyes as well. Lastly, I believe there is hope. If all the Christians of America would vote biblically our nation and world would be a much better place and the moral decay that we observe all over America today would not be as bad as it is today. I also, believe if it were not for previous generations striving to do the right things we would be worse off than our current situation. So be encouraged as you vote, ask God to help you clearly see the character of those who you will vote for and to fully understand the positions of the candidates and the details of the issues before casting a vote that you are held accountable for to God and your Country.

Paving the way for our future

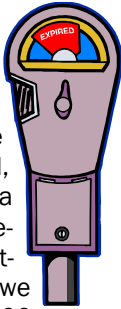

3. From your advantageous seat, you can smile at, gawk at, ignore and otherwise enjoy the rest of the people in the congregation.
4. The pastor is nearly always looking the other way.
5. You're in a wonderful spot to see new members.

6. The cost for all these benefits? Just one evening a week.

7. Oh, yes, one more reason to join the choir: You're a leader in the worship experience.

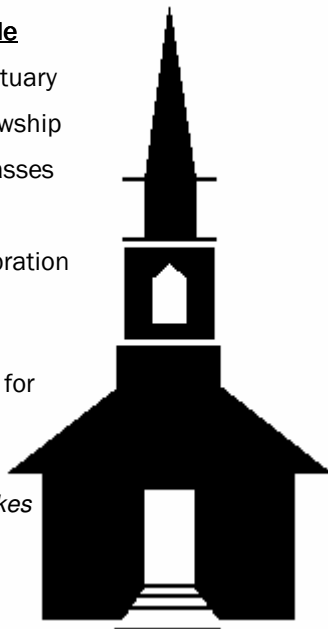
