## **Adult Life Impact**

### **Truth Seekers**

The Truth Seekers class continues to attract members seeking an expository look into Scripture. They engaged in studies about being a Baptist, the Protestant Revolution, and examined other world religions to understand witnessing to them.

### **Harvesters**

The Harvesters class continues to have steady attendance and uses the *Lifeway* quarterly with in-depth study of the curriculum

### **New Beginnings**

The New Beginnings class continues to serve as a building block class for new and developing Christians seeking spirit building lessons and incorporation into Christian Life.

### **Fellowship**

The Fellowship class continues to serve as a bible-based time of worship and reflection primarily for our seasoned saints. This class uses the *Lifeway* quarterly.

## **Children's Church**

Children's Church and Children's choir continue to have curriculum-driven studies that takes students through various theme-based looks at the Scriptures.

## **Children's Life Impact**

The Pre-school to Age 5, K-2 and 3-5 classes have had faithful teachers using curriculum-driven studies that are age appropriate and invest in the spiritual development for each of the classes A new 6-8 class was started to better serve the needs of this age group .

### **Wednesday's at Broadman (WB)**

Wednesday's at Broadman are designed as a time of sanctuary worship through song and prayer and Pastoral-led studies on various topical issues from the Bible. Most of 2009 has been spent on an in depth study of Revelation. Youth have a new 6-8 group and the standard 9-12. They are engaged in the Zone curriculum and the Youth Minister along with members of the Youth Council and other Parental involvement are ministering to this special area in our church

### **Nursery Ministry**

The Nursery Ministry saw the addition of Nursery Coordinators this year to supplement the work of the Nursery Administrator. Upgrades to scheduling and recruitment, teacher training, background checks, curricular development, policies and procedures and general stewardship have been impressive. A marketing plan to ensure this most treasured of ministries stays strong is in development for fall of 2010.

### **Collegiate Ministry**

Through a cooperative effort of the North American Mission Board, the State Convention of Baptist in Ohio, The Summit County Baptist Association and a step of faith by Broadman Baptist Church in agreeing to take on additional salary to the budget, a Collegiate Minister's position was created and a search team was formed.
